

## Primary Election Day: Tuesday, June 28, 2016

Only active registered voters who are affiliated with the Republican or Democratic parties will receive a mail ballot for the Primary Election. Unaffiliated voters will *not* receive a mail ballot. If you wish to affiliate with one of the parties to vote in the Primary, you may [update your voter registration online](#). You may also update your registration and cast a ballot through Election Day at the Voter Service and Polling Center in Elbert County.

**Colorado does not have a Presidential Primary Election**, so there will **not** be a race on the 2016 Primary Election ballot for U.S. President. Instead, Colorado's Republican and Democratic parties elect delegates through the precinct caucus, county assembly and state convention process who will attend their party's national convention and support a presidential candidate.

- Deadline for ballots to be transmitted to military and overseas voters: Saturday, May 14
- First day ballots are mailed to active registered Republican or Democratic voters: Monday, June 6
- Ballot drop-off locations open: Monday, June 6
- Deadline to register to vote in the Primary through a voter registration drive: Monday, June 6
- Deadline to register to vote by mail or online and receive a ballot by mail: Monday, June 20
- Voter Service and Polling Center open: June 20 – June 28th
- Primary Election Day: Tuesday, June 28, 7 a.m. – 7 p.m.

## Presidential Election Day: Tuesday, November 8, 2016

All active registered voters will receive a mail ballot for the Presidential Election. Check your voter registration to ensure that it is active and [update your voter registration online](#). You may also update your registration and cast a ballot through Election Day at any Voter Service and Polling Center in Elbert County.

- First day ballots are mailed to active registered voters: Monday, October 17
- Ballot drop-off locations open: Monday, October 17
- Deadline to register to vote through a voter registration drive: Monday, October 17
- Deadline to register to vote by mail or online and receive a ballot by mail: Monday, October 31
- Voter Service and Polling Centers open: Monday, October 24
- Presidential Election Day: Tuesday, November 8, 7 a.m. – 7 p.m.
