Sam Albrecht, County Manager

Mr. Albrecht shared there was a fire in the Southern part of the county and maybe even into El Paso county. Road and Bridge sent equipment and several agencies responded. He also stated while the recent moisture is nice, it has caused the roads to be muddy. Road and Bridge does not work the roads when they are so muddy. They are working closely with the schools and there were some closures

Dallas Schroeder, Elbert County Clerk

Mr. Schroeder gave a brief update on the upcoming Election. He shared that the County will have a mobile Voter Service and Polling Center this year.

1. Presentation by Elbert County Agricultural Alliance

Diane Kribley, on behalf of ECAA

Ms. Kribley stated they are a non-profit and their focus is on teaching rural agricultural skills. They are teaming with EPR to use the Cimarron athletic field. They plan to install a greenhouse, learning center, information on native plants, managing livestock, and conservation techniques for improving one's property. The goal is to be a resource for those in the community. There is survey on public opinion through Elizabeth Park and Rec. This will be placed on the County Web-site. They are looking at getting some grant money. They are getting a GoCo planning grant. They currently have about 30 members.

JC Cook, EPR President of Park District

Mr. Cook relayed they are the first group that they are willing to partner with EPR to utilize Cimmaron better. This is an outlier park for the District. Mr. Cook shared what happened at their public meeting. There has been concern on access to equestrian trails. There has been questions on flooding. Another concern was about whether trees would be cut down. Answer is no. He asked for support from the commissioners.

2. National 4H Week Proclamation

Kali Benson, CSU Extension

Ms. Benson brought up Willie Wilkins the new Ag Extension agent.

Mr. Wilkins shared a little of his history and stated he is happy to be here.

Danielle Voughtner

Public Comment

Chris McGowan, Colorado Petroleum

Mr. McGowan is here to support the resolution. He talked of the detriment to the Colorado Economy. He shared some surveys and data supporting his position. He thanked the Commissioners for the consideration of opposing this proposition.

Jim Duvall, Elizabeth

Mr. Duvall relayed he was in favor of Prop 112. He suggested that they take a position on the other issues as well and not just one or two.

Commissioner Thayer shared he was in the oil and gas industry. He commented that this particular proposition has impacts within the County. This takes away +98% of drillable locations in the County. He stated how it effects the State economy and harms the mineral rights owner. The State body here is very forceful in enforcement. He thinks this would involve court action due to the loss of revenue to various entities. This would have a substantial negative impact on the county.

Commissioner Richardson talked about the history and direction the Commissioners have put in place. They are looking for stability in the revenue stream for future years. Energy is an option of revenue for the County. They have approved energy projects in the past and this Prop would take this option away.

Vince Harris, CDS on behalf of CDS

Mr. Harris stated the applicant has not agreed to the SIA. Mr. Harris gave a summary of the history that got us to this point. As part of agreement for the approval is for a SIA to be approved. The applicant has not agreed to the expectations and requirements provided in the SIA. In order for applicant to get a building permit, both parties must sign off on the SIA.

Sean O'Hearn, County Engineer

Mr. O'Hearn presented what is in the SIA. This is similar to other SIAs improved. Mr. O'Heran presented a power point that outlines the SIA and discussed the details of the SIA, encompassing a traffic summary, and SIA provisions that are specific to this project. A lot of time and thought to be safe to develop the current SIA.

Applicant

Lorene Grill, The Applicant

DB Speed is a small, family owned business and their dream is to grow and serve Elbert County. They would like the requirement of the SIA signed before they get a building permit and a discussion on 11-foot turn lines. She stated they were told that they did no need and SIA. They did not know they needed a SIA until September. They felt the received incorrect information. They are looking for a win situation. They are also looking for an 11 foot turn lane an 11ft through lane. They noted of other left hand turn lanes on CR 166 were 11 feet wide already. They feel they are receiving conflicting information. They are willing to sign an SIA that is satisfactory to everyone.

There was ongoing discussing on the width of the turn lanes and what the requirements are for the usage would be.

Dave Rubal,



Mr. Rubal has been doing traffic studies for twenty years. He has done other studies in the county. He could not find a standard in the EC regulations, He used stat highway standards. He stated there is another way to determine if a left turn was need. There should be a gap study done. He believes there is enough room to not have the left turn. He felt there will never be a time when there will be a need for a left hand tune.

Mr. O'Hearn asked some questions.

Mr. Rubal and Mr. O'Hearn had a discussion on what the trigger would be for a left hand turn lane.

There was an ongoing discussion of the turn lanes between the Commissioners, Mr. O'Hearn and Mr. Rubal. There was also a discussion of deceleration lanes. Mr. Rubal stated the other improvements down Wind Spirit Lane will be what triggers the left turn lanes.

There was ongoing discussions to trying to find solutions.

Dave Grill, The Applicant

Mr. Grill offered a solution to move forward and try to and re-stripe so there is a turn lane that would be at 11 foot width. He has trouble thinking of putting a lot of money in a road that may be improved later. He felt that the requirements have been changing.

There was ongoing discussion between the applicant and the Commissioners.

Commissioner Thayer asked for this continue until next meeting and for the Applicant to work with the County to find a solution by the next meeting.

The applicant requested a continuance.

Commissioner Willcox stated his concerns in narrowing lanes and narrow turn lanes.

Vince Hooper, Baseline representing CDS

Mr. Hooper said this was two separate hearings. One is a rezone and one a minor development. Mr. Hooper gave the staff summary. The proposal is to have 4 lots all with access to the road. 3 off of 106 and one on CR 17. This is the major point of contention. The Planning commission recommended approval with one condition. This has been met. Mr. Hooper relayed concerns received from a neighbor, dubbed the Olson letter, and this has been given to the applicant and a response given and all the information is in the Commissioner's packets. There was also a staff response to the Olson letter, which Mr. Hooper outlined. Staff recommends approval of the RZ-17-0047 with standard conditions. Staff recommends approval of MD-17-0048 with standard conditions. Planning Commissioner recommends approval.

Tom Maroney, PO box 902 Littleton

Mr. Maroney stated the staff has been thorough in their work. The project has satisfied all referral agencies.

Commissioner Thayer asked staff about paying all fees before recordation. Is there a provision for cash-in-lieu of open space? Yes. This was explained by Mr. Hooper.

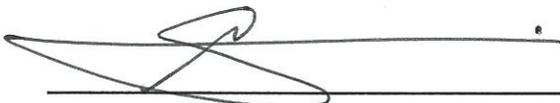

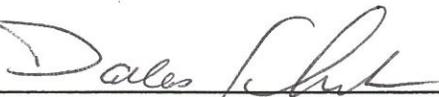
